## Using Questions to Help Preschoolers and Children to Hear, Know and Do God's Word!



We have opportunities throughout our class time to engage our kids in conversations - during our review of the story, our preschool centers and learning activities in the children's classroom. In fact, that the more we utilize conversation during these activities, the more our children will be engaged in their learning. Conversations also provide the opportunity for kids to make the learning personal & act on what they have learned. Consider the following to help you shape the conversations in your classroom as your kids are busy about their learning.
